Rightmire, Sr. He graduated from St. Pius Catholic High School in 1978 where he excelled at football, basketball, and baseball. He was also voted “class favorite” by his peers. After graduation, he continued his baseball career at Blinn Junior College in Brenham, Texas. He then went on to play for Louisiana Tech where he graduated with his B.S. in Forestry in 1982. After college, Rusty was drafted by the Toronto Blue Jays as a pitcher to play professional baseball. In 1990, he met his beloved wife, Beth, of 25 years. The two were married on March 26, 1994, in Conroe, Texas, and have called Montgomery County home ever since. They welcomed their beautiful daughter, Taylor, into the world on January 25, 1999. Rusty recently retired from Federal Express, where he worked as a courier for 27 years. He loved to hunt and fish with family and friends, and was an avid supporter of local sports teams. You could find him on the softball field regularly supporting and coaching Taylor and her fellow teammates. He was a man full of encouragement, positivity and was never seen without his contagious smile.
