I'm sure it was just a coincidence that he was there when a "once in a thousand years" event happened. We were monitored on the picket line by off-duty policemen that CAL hired. The two policemen laughingly told us the story when we arrived at four AM for the morning picket line. Apparently the night before, a scab went out to his car and when he tried to drive it, all four wheels came off simultaneously. The scab was drunk and had to make several calls to the police because he couldn't tell them where he was.
