Alvin Leroy Humphrey, 90, died Thursday December 27, 2018 in Huntsville. He leaves the love of his life, wife of 66 years, Betty Humphrey and sons Randall Lee Humphrey and Russell Wayne Humphrey and wife Tish. Leroy leaves his sister Velma Alice Cole, and grandson Justin Wayne Humphrey and wife Kristin and granddaughters Samantha, Brooke and Constance Humphrey.

He was preceded in death by his parents Daisy Bell and Victor Wayne Humphrey and sisters Naomi Aylor, Madeline Cooke and brother James Alton Humphrey.

Leroy was born in Baytown (Cody), TX September 3, 1928. Leroy and Betty met and decided to be married after their first date. Leroy served his country with service in the Army during the Korean conflict and after two years of service returned to work in the oil and gas industry for forty plus years. Many years ago, Leroy was a keynote speaker at a Petroleum event and later became the first certified petroleum landman in the United States by the organization now known as AAPL.

Long known for his positive outlook on life and sense of humor, Leroy always made his family laugh and smile. His most used expression was "If you can't say something good about someone, then don't say anything at all". He truly practiced what he preached and encouraged his family to do the same.
