All of you became our dear friends and that friendship remained throughout the years. Bob and I were youth counselors and Bill and Annie May worked closely with us. The youth raised money to buy a second-hand bus, however, Bill and Bob were so anxious to get one that they couldn't wait and we ended up with a third-hand bus which we named The Ark. Of course, it had no air-conditioning but it got us where we wanted to go most of the time. We would ride along with the windows open and everyone singing at the tops of their voices with Annie May leading us and Bill or Bob driving. What a wonderful, fun time we had. Of course, Bill and Bob also spent a lot of time under the bus working on it. After they left Beneke in June 1972, we remained friends and stayed in touch especially when they were in Dayton. They were both at the hospital with us when I had surgery in June 1978 and Bob and I were both so thankful for them. They were also with my family and I at Bob's funeral in April 1996. Bill gave a wonderful eulogy. I shall always miss them both but I know they are rejoicing to be together again. They are free to ride a motorcycle, sail on a boat or even ride on an old bus together forever. I feel sure Annie May will find time to teach the angels the words to songs like "The prettiest girl I ever saw was sipping cider through a straw" and, probably, "The Aggie War Hymn".
