February 15, 1918 - June 27, 2007

Ceaburn J. Jones passed away peacefully on June 24, 2007 in Huntsville, Texas. He was born on February 15, 1918 in Groesbeck, Texas, as one of eleven children to parents Jessie and Iva Jones, who preceded him in death. As a young man, Ceaburn proudly served his country overseas in the Army during World War II. After his discharge, he remained an active member of the Veterans of Foreign Affairs until a short time before his death. Upon returning to Texas after the war, Ceaburn worked as a mechanic for many years until his retirement from the Houston Metro Transit Authority. After his retirement in 1979, he spent his time with his friends and family, in service to God as an active lifelong member of the Church of Christ, and enjoying his hobbies of camping and fishing. Ceaburn was preceded in death by his first wife of 39 years, Wynona, and multiple brothers, sisters, brothers-in-law, and sisters-in-law. He is survived by his wife of 14 years, Dorothy; daughter Janet Spradling and husband Joe; grandchildren Josh Spradling and wife Sarah, and Jessica Spradling; sisters Grace Briggs, Juanita Garrett, and Joan Frankin and husband Alvin; and many nieces and nephews.
