Charles Toney Doughtie, age 84, of Hutto, Texas passed away on June 13, 2024 in Round Rock, Texas. He was born on July 21, 1939 in Huntsville, Texas to parents Charles Woodburn and Helen Marie (Toney) Doughtie. Charles served our country in the United States Navy aboard the U.S.S. Perry. 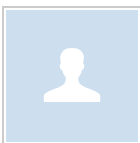
