CHARLES HAMILTON (HAM) TOBLER RETIRED PROFESSOR SHSU Mr. Tobler was born in Spiro, Oklahoma on July 8, 1918. He was reared and attended school through Jr. College level in Fort Smith, Arkansas and graduated from Kansas State Teachers College in Pittsburg, Kansas with both a Bachelor of Science and Master of Science degrees and post graduate PhD course work at Texas A&M. He taught at the secondary level for twenty years in public schools in Arkansas and then twenty three years at Sam Houston State University. Mr. Tobler was a member of the First United Methodist Church and active in the Builders Sunday School Class. Ham did the printing for the church for many years after he retired. He was an active member and past president of the Lions Club and was awarded the Melvin Jones Fellowship this year from Lions Club International and the Huntsville Lions Club. He was also an active member of the local chapter of AARP and the Texas Association of College Teachers and International Graphic Arts Education Associations. Ham is survived by his wife of 61 years Geraldine (Jerry) Morton Tobler. He is preceded in death by his parents and two sons, Steven Morton Tobler in 1977 and Mark Hamilton Tobler in 1991, numerous nieces and nephews and a special niece, Susan Hefley Weir of Little Rock, Arkansas. Services will be held Tuesday, July 24, 2007 at First United Methodist Church at 2:30PM with Rev. Bruce Hay officiating. Interment will follow at Brooke Cemetery under the direction of Sam Houston Memorial Funeral Home. Visitation will be held on Monday, July 23, 2007 from 5:00 until
