



## Charles O. Warner IV

January 19, 1951 - May 3, 2020

Charles O. Warner, IV, age 69 passed away peacefully at home in Huntsville, Texas surrounded by family on May 3, 2020 after a brave two-year battle with liver cancer. Charles was born January 19, 1951 to Charles O. Warner, III and Mary Yvonne (Knox) Warner in Baytown, Texas. He was a 1969 graduate of Angleton High School.
