



Clyde "Bo" Hall

March 12, 1932 - May 5, 2006

Services for Clyde Frank "Bo" Hall, 74, of Huntsville are scheduled for 11 a.m. Friday, May 5, 2006, at First United Methodist Church of Huntsville with Rev. Bruce Hey officiating. Burial will follow in Adickes Addition of Oakwood Cemetery under the direction of Sam Houston Memorial Funeral Home, Huntsville. Bo Hall died on May 2, 2006 after his long courageous battle with lengthy illness. Bo was born March 12, 1932 in Huntsville to the late Clyde Ernest and Odell Weatherly Hall. He served in the Air National Guard from 1953-1960. Bo left Texas in 1965 for Spartanburg South Carolina but returned to Huntsville in 1977. Bo was best known for his strong interest in flags, The Hall Of Flags, where he colored the streets of Huntsville with his uniquely designed flags. Bo's ability to sing was the one true love of his life as member of the choir at the First United Methodist Church. Bo's son, Roger Lee Hall, preceded him in death. Survivors include daughter, Susan D. Hall of Athens, son C. Allan Hall of Huntsville, sister Maryleeann Bryan of Austin, sister Nancy Hollis of Huntsville, brother Charles Hall of Houston and grandson R. Lee Hall II of Pacolet. The family will receive friends from 6-8 p.m. Thursday, May 4 at the funeral home. “ Dear Mom & Dad, and Uncle Charlie & Aunt Joy, and Aunt Nancy & Uncle Jerry, and Susan and Allan,

I'm saddened to hear of the passing of Uncle Bo. I never heard of his interest in flags at all before in my life, much less of how he decorated Huntsville, Texas with them.

I remember that he and I seemed to have several common interests, like Photography and Computers. We were both in Alpha Phi Omega National Service Fraternity, though he was in it at Sam Houston State University and I was in it at East Texas State University - now Texas A&M - Commerce, Texas; whose chapter is or was known as the Beta Delta Chapter. I wonder if he was a Turtle. Too late to ask him now. I remember his planes. I remember him taking me and Laura and Dude and Doug to the Huntsville Airport and he took Dude and Doug up in the plane first and then he took Laura and I up in the plane next and I was delighted and enjoyed it and had fun. I even got to call in the call number on the side of the plane with whatever keywords we were supposed use for the letters. I remember that they had a dartboard on the side of the garage at the old house on Avenue P, that I think belonged to Bo. The only other person I remember being called "Bo" that I knew well was Bo Echols of Fort Smith, Arkansas, and the peer I know today that has a pilot's license (the one I know the best that is), is a guy named "Robert Allen Gwinn, Jr." who looks a lot like Dude and David Hall to me except that Allen has very blond hair.

My sympathies go out to Susan and Allan and to Roger Junior.

I know he was married to a woman named "Carolyn" once, for a very long time, but I had heard that they were divorced and I don't know what has become of her. So, my condolences go out to her also because her heart is probably still bound to him. I know because I'm divorced too, but I'm still in touch with my husband.

I hope that my mom and Uncle Charlie and Aunt Nancy are holding

up O.K., too.

I can't make it down there and I wish I could.
