Maurice Albert "Moe" January, 91, passed away April 28, 2013 in Conroe, Texas. He was born October 23, 1921 in San Francisco, California to Leonard and Clotilde January.

Moe entered the United States Air Force in 1943 and retired as Lieutenant Colonel in 1963, serving as a pilot in the Asiatic – Pacific Campaign. He married Florence Turney in 1947. He and Flo retired to Sunrise Beach, Texas where he served as Fire Chief of the Sunrise Beach Volunteer Fire Department in addition to owning and operating January's Backachers, specializing in ornamental ironwork and boat lifts.

After Florence passed away, he married Connie Taliaferro Scales in 1975. After Connie passed away he moved to Huntsville, Texas. After moving, Moe had the opportunity to explore one of his many passions in life, model railroading. He was a member of the All Points North Club in Conroe, where he was an active contributor in layout design and building.

He was a Masonic brother Ancient Free and Accepted Masons, member of The Scottish Rites Body and Alzafar Scottish Rites.

Moe is preceded in death by his wives, parents, and brother-in-law Lloyd Taliaferro. Moe is survived by Lloyd's wife, Pat Taliaferro; brother-in-law, Landon Taliaferro and his wife Joyce; nieces Stacey King, Jill Bares, Cindy Gallaway; nephew Jeff Taliaferro and many close friends he considered family.

A graveside service will be held Thursday, May 2, 1:00 p.m., at the Mayes Addition of Oakwood Cemetery in Huntsville, Texas with Pastor Cheryl Smith of Wesley Memorial United Methodist Church officiating.
