



## Crawford Scott

February 8, 1915 - February 3, 2008

Crawford Wells Scott was Born February 8, 1915 in Purmela, Texas. The only son of Zim and Addie Cassandra Scott last of Gatesville, Texas, Crawford graduated from Gatesville High School in 1932 and then studied at Texas A&M. He married Rose Ethel Routh of Gatesville, Texas on September 4, 1937 in Gatesville and worked there for nearly 30 years, first as the owner of the Gatesville Laundry and then owner of the Gatesville Ice Company. He was a member of the First Baptist Church of Gatesville. As a member of the Gatesville Volunteer Fire Department, he organized the Firemen's Rodeo each summer. He was a member of the Gatesville Masonic Lodge for over 60 years and President of the Gatesville Chamber of Commerce. A Boy Scout from the age of 12, Crawford later sat on the Board of Directors for the Heart of Texas Council of the Boy Scouts of America and was an Honorary Member of the Order of the Arrow. Crawford moved his family to Huntsville in 1962 where he installed and then managed the first cable television system in Walker County. Crawford and Ethel are members of the First Baptist Church in Huntsville, Texas. Crawford was happiest when surrounded by his family and is survived by Ethel and their two sons Crawford Warick Scott and Roland Keith Scott and grandchildren Keith Lawson Scott, Paul Keith Scott and Nancy Ann Deaver. He has two great grandchildren Alexander Netto Scott and Sadie Louise Scott. Services will be held at 2:00 pm Sunday, February 3, 2008 at the Chapel of First Baptist Church, Huntsville, Texas. Interment will be at 2:00 pm Monday, February 4, 2008 at Gatesville City Cemetery, Gatesville,
