Danny Hoffman was born July 12, 1956 in McKinney, Texas to Leonard and Ida Maie Hoffman. He graduated from Huntsville High School in 1974, Sam Houston State University in 1978, where he was President of the Fellowship of Christian Athletes, and Prairie View A&M in 2000 with a Master's in Education Administration. Danny married the love of his life, Donna Pennington, on August 8, 1981 in First Christian Church, McKinney, Texas. The Lord's call on his life lead him to serve in public schools teaching, coaching, and administrating. This path led him to Goodrich ISD, Madisonville ISD, McKinney ISD, Mt. Pleasant ISD, Huntsville ISD, Splendora ISD, Anderson ISD, Wyndham ISD, Buffalo ISD, Cameron ISD, and Hearne ISD. He had a special talent for remembering each student and could call them by name. His faith was strong in the Lord and he lived the life God called Him to with no fear and no regrets. He had a passion for sports and was a walking dictionary of sports information. Danny had a special love for the Christmas season and would listen to Christmas music all year round.

Danny is preceded in death by his parents, Leonard and Ida Maie Hoffman, and brother Charles Hoffman. He is survived by his wife, Donna, his sisters Judith Holliday and Suzanne Hoffman, Brother and Sister-in-Law Brad & Becky Kindle, nieces Hannah Kindle, Emma Kindle, Danielle Boysen, and nephew Charles Holliday and many other great nieces and nephews.

I went to OKC to graduate from a small liberal arts christian college. Sam's graduation was two days prior to mine, and since Danny had already bought his cap and gown, he brought it up to school, put it on for a solemn graduation ceremony, and stood next to me as the College President walked around a big outdoor circle congratulating the outgoing Seniors. When he came to Danny, he didn't recognize this giant of a man being on campus. (class size about 250). The President had a dumbfounded look on his face. Danny looked him in the eye, smiled, winked , and said " Whaas happenin Bebbe?"

We stayed close for about 10 years, but as I moved off to California, and we both got involved in our separate lives, our communications became less frequent. I'll never forget our times together as young men, and his influence was a BIG positive in my life.
