David S. Herman, 73, passed away at his home in Montgomery, Texas on April 2, 2020. He was born on April 30, 1946 in Pittsburg, Kansas to parents Robert S. Herman and Oliva Herman.

He is survived by his wife of 51 years, Janet M. Herman; and his 2 sons, Chad S. Herman (Stacey) and Scott A. Herman (Meggan). He is also survived by his 2 sisters, Bobbye Cukjati and Lori Lowery; brother, Stephen Herman; and 4 grandchildren, Ashlyn Elizabeth, Justin David, Jordan Marie and Hailey Lauren.

David served in the U.S. Army as a 1st Lt., 805th Transportation Co., Republic of Vietnam, 1970-1971. He graduated from St. Mary's High School in Pittsburg, Kansas in 1964. He then went on to graduate from Pittsburg State University in 1969 with a degree in history and a minor in business administration. He was a member of the PSU swim team and a member of the Phi Sigma Epsilon Fraternity. At the age of 14 he obtained the rank of Eagle Scout, Troop 60, Pittsburg, Kansas.

David spent his professional career in the credit and finance field. He retired in 2017 and enjoyed golfing, fishing, being outdoors, traveling abroad, and being with his family. He and his wife, Janet, attended the Lone Star Cowboy Church in Montgomery, Texas. A Memorial Service will be held at the church at a later

date.
