



Donald George Donegan

December 31, 1923 - January 18, 2013

Donald George Donegan passed away on January 8, 2013 at the age of 89. He was born in Hillsboro, New Hampshire, on December 31, 1923. He is preceded in death by his mother, Rosemary Gloddy-Donegan, his father, Daniel Donegan, brother Herman and sister, Barbara Bailey. He is survived by his wife Janet, daughter, Sonya Clover, son-in-law Lonnie Clover, son Keith Donegan, granddaughters, Candace A. Carver (Skip), Catherine M. Dominguez (Joseph) and McKenzie Donegan; five great grandchildren, numerous nieces and nephews. After high school, Donald enlisted in the Navy and was commissioned as an ensign. Later he was ordered into the Scout-Raiders – Navy Intelligence, which in 1947 would be renamed the Navy SEALs. Following the war, he graduated from the University of New Hampshire in 1949. After graduation, Donald moved to Sidney, Ohio to work for the state highway department. He met his wife, Janet in Sidney, Ohio and they were married in August, 1951. In 1952, he and Janet, along with her daughter Sonya moved to Houston Texas. Donald was Vice President of Bovay Engineers. He was also past President of the San Jacinto Chapter of Professional Engineers, past President of the Texas Professional Engineers in Private Practice and founding President of the Sun-Rise Chapter of Rotary in Tyler, Texas. Donald and Janet moved to Tyler, Texas in 1983 where he worked for Velvin-Weeks Engineers and he eventually retired from Houston Metropolitan Authority in 1999 and moved to Montgomery, Texas. A memorial service will be held on Friday, January 18, 2013 at 11 a.m. at Montgomery
