Obituary Donna Steiner Neumeyer

A memorial service will be held to celebrate the life of Donna Steiner Neumeyer on Saturday, January 30, 2016. Visitation will be held at 10:00 a.m. with the memorial to be held immediately after at 11:00 a.m. at First Methodist Church in Liberty. Donna was a long-time resident of Liberty and most recently of Huntsville, Texas. She has been interred in the Cooke Memorial Cemetery.

At her birth in 1922, Donna was the third of four daughters of Allen and Adeleine Steiner of Fargo, North Dakota. She grew up in Fargo and graduated from North Dakota Agricultural College, now North Dakota State University, in 1944. She then located in Stillwater, Oklahoma where she was a dietician and met her future husband, Louis. They were married in 1947 and lived together for the next sixty six years until his death in 2013. Their life together took them to Marshall for 18 years before moving to Liberty in 1966 where they resided until his death.

Donna loved to spend time her family and friends, to travel, to play bridge, to sing in the church choir, to play violin (especially in Valley Players' productions) and to entertain. She was an excellent seamstress and was very talented in art and crafts. She taught school briefly in LISD and was very

active in her church.

Donna is preceded in death by her parents, husband, sisters, and one daughter, Becky Slade. Survivors include a daughter Nancy Gatlin (Gerald), granddaughter Marsha Stringer (Don), and grandson Bart (Tonya). Also surviving her are four great grandchildren: Garrett and Gatlin Stringer and Ashley and Joseph Gatlin.
