March 21, 1918 - December 18, 2009

Dorman William “Red” Hill was born in Kingsland, Texas on March 21, 1918, and died at home in Willis, Texas on December 16, 2009. He began his career in the Kingsland-Llano area with Brown & Root on the Marshal Ford Dam (Mansfield Dam) project in 1936; spending 45 years with Brown & Root before retiring. Dorman was an avid sportsman and firearm aficionado. He also loved to garden and enjoyed spending time with his cats. He joined Park Place Lodge in Houston in 1958 and was very active for many years becoming a Thirty-Second Degree Scottish Rite Mason and Shriner.
