Douglas Eugene Rassinier was born on December 13, 1952 in Bartlesville, Oklahoma and the first male born in Jane Phillips Memorial Hospital. Shortly thereafter the family moved to Texas. He tragically died on February 3, 2009 at the age of 56 in New Waverly, Texas. Doug graduated from Lamar High School and attended the University of Texas. After college, he commenced a career as a general contractor beginning in home remodeling and painting and ultimately owning Restaurant Repair & Maintenance, Inc., providing services to restaurant chains throughout the south central part of the country.
