



Edward George Gilchrist

August 21, 1921 - September 3, 2006

Edward George Gilchrist, 85, passed away on August 30, 2006 at The Methodist Hospital in Houston, Texas. He was born on August 21, 1921 in Chicago, Illinois. He was preceded in death by his wife, Elizabeth “Betty” Gilchrist in 1970; his parents, Anna and Alexander Gilchrist in 1983, and granddaughter, Carly Alexandra Gilchrist in 1990. Edward was a proud United States Veteran, enlisting in the Navy in 1942 and serving as a Boatswain’s Mate Second Class aboard the USS LCT #13, the USS LST #72, the USS LST #34, and the USS LST #674. While serving aboard the USS LST #34, he participated in the battle of the Gilbert Islands in late 1943 within a unit which was the original assault on the Tarawa Atoll. From there he joined in the invasion and occupation of the Kwajalein Atoll, and the invasion and occupation of Eniwetok, both in 1944. His last battle was that for Saipan Island in the Marianas, in which he volunteered to escort amphibious forces to battle. He was honorably discharged shortly after WWII came to an end, being awarded 5 battle stars and good conduct medals. In civilian life, Edward became a journeyman electrician with the International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers Union, which he was a member of for 58 years. He had a zest for life, always making sure things were done right and with purpose. He loved to travel, enjoying taking cruises with his family and seeing the world. Edward is survived by his son, Alexander Anton Gilchrist, daughter-in-law Darla Baird Gilchrist, two granddaughters, Coty and Holly Gilchrist, and one great grandson, Alexander Dean Gilchrist, all from Montgomery. Much

appreciation is extended to the following for the care given to Edward in his last years; Hearthstone at Rivershire, Heritage at Tomball, Senior Residence at Conroe and to Darla Gilchrist for her always being there for Edward when needed.
