



## Elizabeth Ann Granberry

June 2, 1928 - February 22, 2014

Elizabeth Ann McDougald Granberry passed to Heaven on February 19, 2014, at the age of 85. Ann was born June 2, 1928, in Ft. Smith, Arkansas. She grew up in Houston with her parents, Audrey and Truman, and her sister Jean. Ann graduated from Stephen F. Austin High School in Houston in 1945. As a student there she was a member of the Quill and Scroll Club and the Scottish Brigade; she was also head cheerleader her senior year. After graduation from high school Ann began what would become a long career in the business world. She joined an advertising agency, serving as a secretary as well as a model in their ads. She then worked for various area petrochemical construction companies through the years. Ann continued her education by taking business and accounting courses while she worked. Her career culminated with a position as an administrative assistant and financial adviser to the head of McCauley Controls Company. Ann married Hugh Granberry, her high school sweetheart, on December 7, 1945. They built a wonderful life together, and their partnership lasted for 65 years until his death in 2009. Ann's interests included participating in the San Jacinto Skiers with family and friends, writing, painting, reading, and studying the Bible. She was always a faithful church member, and for many years she especially enjoyed teaching the Sisters in Christ Sunday school class at University Heights Baptist Church in Huntsville. Above all, Ann delighted in spending time with her family. Ann was preceded in death by her husband Hugh and her parents. She is survived by her loving son, Michael; her daughter-in-law, Wanda; and

her grandsons, Matthew and Marcus. She is also survived by her dear sister, Jean McIntosh, and brother-in-law Thomas McIntosh; nephew Kevin McIntosh, his wife, Kim, and children Nicole, Jacob, Isabella, and Mason; and niece Karen Stubblefield, her husband, Scott, and son, Ryon.
