She was born in “The Possum Walk Community” (Bath Community) on FM 1374 on April 7, 1920 as the daughter of Moses (Mose) B. Allen and Lillie I. Osborne Allen and she was the last surviving child of the couple. She graduated for Huntsville High School and she married J. Sam Angier, Jr. in 1936. As a life-long Baptist, she was the great-granddaughter of Rev. T.S. Allen, who organized the First Baptist Church of Dallas. She and her husband J. Sam lived in several South American countries as he was in the oil industry.
