Our precious mother, Fleetwood Warner Range, 81, died on February 25, 2020. Fleetwood was born in Houston TX on February 13, 1939, the daughter of Merritt Allen Warner and Katharine Vinson Warner both of Huntsville, TX; the granddaughter of Gibbs and Lilah Vinson, also of Huntsville, TX.

“ *I went through West U Elementary with Fleetwood, in the mid-term classes. She and Dorothy Wilson were the brains in the group. In higher grades we still had some classes together, and she was always a top student. And she was as nice as she was smart.*

I last saw her at the Lamar 60th reunion in October of 2017. She was having mobility problems. When I asked about it, she told me very calmly that she was dying of cancer, and probably only had a year or two to live. She said that she wasn't fighting it, she was confident that she would move on to a better life. Her cheerful acceptance was surprising to me, especially since my wife Judy was in the midst of cancer treatments at the time. In fact, Judy died that December, so Fleetwood outlasted her by a couple of years. Judy also faced the inevitable with grace; it was much harder on me.
