After graduating from high school in Jacksonville, she moved to Houston where she graduated from business college and began a successful career in the business world. They eventually moved to Oklahoma City, Oklahoma where Fran and Jack developed lifelong friendships through their involvement in their church and the Gideons International. Fran served as the State Chaplain for the Gideons International for three years. After returning to Texas, Fran and Jack were founding members of the Walden Community Church, established in 1983, where Jack served as the first pastor. Fran served in many capacities within the church and established the church library now know as the Fran Treed Library where she devoted numerous hours as the church librarian for the last thirteen years. granted her the special gift of encouraging others. Fran will be revered by her friends and family as a "woman of faith" who lived the Word. Fran demonstrated a cheerful attitude and unwavering faith in God's grace through problems and circumstances of extraordinary proportions.
