Frank Edward Price, faithful Christian, devoted husband, loving father, granddad and great-granddad, gained his heavenly reward on September 1, 2017.

He was preceded in death by his parents- Gertie Price, Joseph S. Price and stepmother Buena Price, his sister Edith Tullos, and three brothers – Howard Price, Joe Price and James Price.

Frank was a man of passion and love. He adored his wife, Dorothy Russell Price, with his whole heart and treasured her throughout their 69 years of marriage. Frank loved all of his four children and their chosen spouses: Wade Price and Sarah of Houston, TX, Wanda Price Childress and Richard of Austin, TX, Cecil Price and Nicky of Hereford, AZ, and Carey Price and Mary of Huntsville, TX. His thirteen grandchildren were precious to him: Cheryl Price, Laura Price-Miller & Ben, Melanie Price Adams & Stephen, Mary Price, Ben Childress, Jacob Childress & Jackie, Bonnie Childress, Frank Price II, John-Michael Price & Summer, Elizabeth Price, Cianna Price McEver & David, Lindsey Price and Lacey Price. His 10 great-grandchildren were sources of great joy to him as well: Aubrey, Terry, Treyton, & Sadie Miller, Charles Podrovitz, Connor and Maggie Adams, Solaura and Leianna Naylor, and Logan McEver. Frank is also survived by his siblings- Ted Price, Lloyd Price and Jane Marsh, as well as many nephews, nieces, and dear friends.

Frank Price was born on October 26, 1926 in Corsicana, Texas. He grew up on a farm in the community of Huntington, Texas. Frank joined the U.S. Navy, and served as a radio operator aboard ships during World War II and the Korean War. He married his sweet, loving wife, Dorothy, on December 27, 1947. After his time with the Navy, Frank wisely used the GI Bill to further his education, first at Sam Houston State Teachers College with a Bachelor of Science in 1949, and then at Stephen F. Austin State College with a Master's in Education in 1951. Frank & Dorothy then settled in Houston as he began his teaching career, first in the Houston ISD, then later at South Texas Junior College, which later became the University of Houston Downtown. He retired from UHD as a professor of biology in 1988, and moved to Huntsville in 1992 to enjoy his retirement. Frank served as a member and officer of local chapters of Retired Teachers Association and AARP.

Frank had a passion for plants and gardening. He grew it, Dorothy canned it, and everyone enjoyed it. From green beans to peppers, Frank had a green thumb. He took great pride in his gardens. He especially loved to grow various peppers and create his own blend of hot sauce or dried pepper seasoning. Frank always carried his pepper concoctions with him in jars, film canisters, or even tic-tac containers. He never left home without them.

Frank had the heart of a servant throughout his life. Frank began teaching Bible classes in 1948. Frank served as an elder of the church in three congregations, Bellfort Church of Christ, Lawndale Church of Christ, both in Houston, and at the Huntsville Church of Christ. Frank and Dorothy truly lived Hebrews 13:2 as he showed hospitality to church members and visitors alike. He also supported and taught at the Foundation School of Church Music since 1968, training song leaders in central Texas. In 1977, Frank began working with Baxter Institute of Biblical and Cultural Studies, training preachers in the church, teaching occasional classes and serving on the Board of Directors for

many years. He often traveled to Tegucigalpa, Honduras to attend graduations and encourage the brethren until his retirement from the Board in 2007.

One of Frank's greatest joys was singing. He was blessed with a wonderful voice and a desire to use it for God's service. Starting in childhood, Frank led singing any time he could at church, singings, and gospel meetings. They hosted many gospel singings in their home. Frank and his family also sang at singing events all over the city of Houston as his children grew up. Frank and Dorothy often attended various Sacred Harp singings around the state. He passed his love of singing down to all of his family. Children, grandchildren, and great-grandchildren came together as often as they could to sing with and for him. Music was in his heart to the very end, and he could sing a song even when he couldn't form a sentence. Frank's legacy of loving God, family and music will continue to be a source of joy and comfort for those who knew him best. Romans 8:28
