Fred Himstedt, Jr. Fred Himstedt, Jr. was born in Wichita Falls, Texas on June 9, 1929 , and died in Huntsville, Texas on December 14, 2010. Fred was preceded in death by his father Fred Himstedt, Sr.; his mother Ruth Smith Himstedt, and a younger brother William Carl Himstedt. He leaves behind his wife Carlene Morris Himstedt and his younger sister Tillie Himstedt. He also leaves behind a son Fred Himstedt III and wife Cherry, a daughter Freida Himstedt Bryson and husband Hoy, and son D. J. (Dennis Jay) Himstedt and wife Julie. He also leaves behind 10 grandchildren and 9 great grandchildren. Fred was a graduate of Wichita Falls High School and had attended Hardin Junior College, Cameron College and Oklahoma A & M. Fred also earned a diploma in Religious Education from Southwestern Baptist Theological Seminary. He met and married Carlene Morris in 1949. Fred worked for Halliburton in the oilfields of north Texas in his young adult years. In his middle adult years he served as Minister of Education of Westbury Baptist Church and Easthaven Baptist Church (both in Houston, Texas). His latter years he worked for Texas Marine and Industrial Supply Co. until his retirement in 1989. In retirement Fred volunteered with the Texas Baptist Retiree Builders building churches all over Texas, Japan, Brazil, and Canada. Fred was a lifelong blood donor, falling short only 2 pints of donating twenty gallons. Fred served as President of the local chapter of the Christian Motorcyclists Association and served on the board of Polk County's chapter of Habitat for Humanity. Fred and Carlene enjoyed cruises to various parts of the world and Fred lived out

his final years at the Carriage Inn of Huntsville, Texas, an independent living community for senior adults known as “a cruise ship on land”. A memorial service will be held for Fred at University Heights Baptist Church, Huntsville, TX at 2:00 p.m., Saturday, December 18, 2010.
