George Edward Dudley, 87, passed away peacefully on Monday, March 21, 2011. He was born June 09, 1923 in Seabrook, Texas to parents George and Grace Dudley. He was preceded in death by his parents and brothers Frank Dudley and Larry Pelczar. He was also awarded the Presidential Unit Citation-Good Conduct, Asiatic Pacific (3-stars), American Theater and the World War II Victory medals. He was a member of the Second Marine Division Association, and numerous other Marine Associations and Sheriff's Association of Texas. George retired from Conroe I.S.D. as an electrical supervisor. George and Gerry were married February 27, 1948 in a double ceremony with their dear friends Sam and Jackie Pumilia. George and Gerry made their home in Montgomery for over 40 years where he was a Captain in the Lake Conroe Volunteer Fire Dept. The family will receive visitors at Sam Houston Memorial Funeral Home on Thursday, March 24, 2011 from 6 -8 pm. Graveside services will be held on Friday, March 25, 2011 at 9 am at the Houston National Cemetery, 10410
