Harold Lloyd Gann, 75, of Conroe, Texas passed away at his home Thursday May 26, 2011. A traditional, military memorial service will be held in his honor at the V.F.W. Post 4709 in Conroe Friday June 3rd at 10:30 AM. He was born December 5, 1935 in Terral, Oklahoma to the late Lloyd and Jane Rogers Gann. Harold was a decorated veteran of the Korean War. During his tour, he proudly served as a Ranger in the U.S. Army. Following his military service he resided in Livingston, Texas where he began his lifelong career as an independent utility contractor. He was also involved in the Masonic Lodge of Livingston as a Master Mason and Past Worthy Patron. His career led him to Mount Pleasant, Texas where he lived for nearly 20 years.
