



## Hartford Gene Mowry

July 5, 1931 - April 12, 2010

Hartford Gene Mowry, 78, died April 8, 2010, at his home in Huntsville, Texas of natural causes. A memorial service will be held at 4 pm April 12, 2010 at Sam Houston Memorial Funeral Home, at 1700 Normal Park, Huntsville, TX. Hartford Mowry was born July 5, 1931, in Greenville, PA., to Stanley and Thelma Mowry. He graduated from Penn High school and worked for the Bessemer Rail Road in Greenville. Hartford enlisted in United States Air Force where he retired after twenty one years of service and was a Vietnam Veteran. He moved to Texas in 1971 where he made his home in Abilene. He attended Cisco Junior College where he received two Associate degrees. In 1987, he retired from Texas Instruments where he was an R&M technician. He moved to Huntsville, TX in 2006 to be closer to his family. Hart enjoyed hunting, fishing, and golfing, spending time with his family and his beloved Dachshund, Buddy. His family wrote: "Hart loved hunting, fishing and golfing with his sons. He will be missed greatly by his family and friends." Hartford Mowry is survived by his wife, Elaine Mowry; brother Tom Mowry and sister Beverly Reno, both of Greenville, PA; daughter, Teresa Mowry; sons, Stanley Mowry, Michael Mowry and Robert Mowry; daughters-in-law, Rae Mowry, Cynthia Skonberg-Mowry and Nancy Mowry; and 7 grandchildren and 5 great-grandchildren.
