Howell Ross Mitchell, 85 years old peacefully met his Lord and Savior on November 26, 2021. He was a proud, loving and exceptional husband, father and grandfather. Howell was born on January 30, 1936 in Palestine Texas as the only son to the late Waymon Mitchell Jr. and Ruth Evans Mitchell.
