



James "Jim" Kubasta

October 29, 1940 - September 14, 2024

James "Jim" Kubasta, a devoted family man and accomplished professional, passed away peacefully on September 14, 2024, at the age of 83. Born on October 29, 1940, in Oshkosh, Wisconsin, Jim's life was filled with love, dedication, and adventure. He will be remembered for his devotion to family, his professional achievements, and the love and laughter he shared with those around him.

Jim is survived by his loving wife, Pat, with whom he shared many cherished memories. Together, they raised three children, each of whom brought him immense pride: Jodi Territo and her husband, Paul; Carrie Kubasta Burns; and Kelly Kubasta and his wife, Britnee. Jim was also a proud grandfather to six grandchildren: Samantha and Reneé Territo; Randi Burns Gomez and her husband, Joe, and their four children; Joey Burns and his wife, Lauren; and Jamie and Averee Kubasta.

Jim's career in the oil and gas industry began with Shell in California, where he embarked on a path that took him around the world. Over the years, he also worked for Odeco, Hydrotech, and Vetco, with positions that brought him and his family to places like New Orleans, Scotland, Houston, and California (Los Angeles, Bakersfield, Ventura, Camarillo). His final role before retirement was with Dril-Quip in Houston, marking the end of a distinguished career.

Many of Jim's closest lifelong friends were made through the shared experiences of his professional life.

In retirement, Jim returned to Wisconsin, settling in Wautoma, where he

embraced a quieter life. In his later years, he moved to Montgomery, Texas, to be closer to his children.

Throughout his life, Jim enjoyed traveling to exotic locales, telling stories, snow skiing, challenging himself with puzzles, playing card games, and discussing geologic and rock formations. And, of course, everyone knows how much he loved a good practical joke—with most of us being a victim at some point or another.

Jim leaves behind family and friends whose lives were deeply enriched by his presence, wisdom, and humor. He will be missed, but his legacy will live on through those who knew and loved him.
