Since that time he has worked the business, raised two sons and watched his family grow and prosper. He believed that going to work every day kept him a strong man and continued to work even when his health was beginning to decline. There were numerous extended family and friends along

the way. He loved to hunt, tell stories of his years driving a truck and his time spent in the 82nd Airborne, work the barbeque trailer and spending time with his family.
