JO ANN KRAUSZER, resident of Bentwater, Montgomery, Texas passed away June 26, 2009 after a long battle with the complications of Polycystic Kidney Disease. She was born in Perth Amboy, New Jersey on June 17, 1946 to Samuel Jonelunas and Dora A. Calvo. She was raised in Edison, New Jersey, attending Edison High School and then St Francis Nursing School in Trenton, New Jersey. In 1968, she married Steve Krauszer and practiced pediatric nursing in suburban Philadelphia. After overseas assignments in Denmark and Okinawa, they moved to Houston where Jo Ann practiced allergy nursing and raised a family of two. During that time she established several life-long friends. In 1999, she and Steve retired to Montgomery and joined St Mary's Church in Plantersville, adding to her long list of friends. She battled the complications of Polycystic Kidney Disease tirelessly and her tenacity became an inspiration to others. Jo Ann was preceded in death by her father Samuel Jonelunas.
