John Frederick Lent was born May 17, 1921 in Saginaw, MI to Frederick Joseph and Mercedes (Remer) Lent and passed away November 20, 2007 in Huntsville. He grew up in Wyandotte, MI and enlisted in the Marines after graduating from high school. He served in World War II at Guado Canal earning a purple heart in the 1st. Marines. He married Lois Wiley in 1946 at St. Stephens Episcopal Church. After his military service he started to work for Stran Steel Corporation as an estimator and manager for over 40 years. They moved to Huntsville in 1985. After retirement he became an avid golfer and was the President of the MGA of Elkins Lake , a member of the Legionaires and an Elk. He is survived by his wife Lois Lent of 61 years, son William Lent and wife Robin of Spring, granddaughter June Herman and husband Brett of Austin, and grandson Dr. James Lent of West Hollywood, Ca.
