Obituary

John Allen McGee, Jr. was born in Shiro, Texas on October 24, 1922. He was the 5th of nine children born to John Allen McGee, Sr. and D.T. (Walker) McGee. Most of his childhood was spent in Shiro and Huntsville, Texas. He graduated from Sam Houston High School in Huntsville and attended Huston Tillotson College in Austin, Texas.

John served two years in the United States Army during World War II from February 15, 1943 to November 1, 1945. He received the European-African-Middle Eastern Campaign Medal with two Bronze Stars, Good Conduct Medal, Victory Ribbon and 4 Overseas Service Bars.

After his discharge from the Army, John worked 32 years with the federal government with the General Service Administration in Denver, Colorado. Upon his retirement, he moved to Huntsville, Texas to become a “Cowboy”

where he enjoyed riding his horses and raising cattle.

John was previously married to Vera Allen, who preceded him in death. Three children were born from this union. Later, he married Regetta Nevins, to whom he was married to for 45 years before her death in 2005.

Preceding him in death are: parents, John A. McGee, Sr. and D.T. McGee; wife, Regetta McGee; son, Jon McGee, Sr.; grandson, Gary McGee; step-son, Howard Nevins; siblings, Jessie McGee, Willie McGee, James McGee, Lindberg McGee, Fay McGee Ruffin and Doris McGee Young.
