April 28, 1970 - August 22, 2023

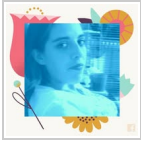
John Allen Ransom was born on April 28, 1970, and went to be with the Lord on August 22, 2023 in Conroe Texas at the age of 53.
