



## John Stockdale Robinson, III

John Stockdale Robinson, III, 78 of Huntsville, Texas passed away on Monday, August 2, 2021. He wished that his ashes be spread on his ranch and family will follow his request at a later date.

Born in Teague, TX to John S. Robinson, Jr. and Elmadel Driscoll Robinson, he lived with his parents in Raymondville, TX until he graduated from Raymondville High school. John graduated from Sam Houston State University in 1965 with a BBA and later an MBA degree from University of Houston, where he lived and took on the role as Vice President of the family oil business. During which time he worked at Rice grocery stores as an accountant, later for the Texas State Comptroller a short time, and in 1984, obtained his CPA certification establishing his own accounting firm. His motto was, "Unto Caesar which is Caesar's and not one damn cent more."

John moved back to Huntsville in the early 2000s to be near his father, JS and help run the family businesses. He was raised as a cattleman's son and enjoyed being a crusty cowboy at his ranch after retiring from the accounting business in 2006.

He was a lifelong supporter of the Pi Kappa Alpha fraternity and higher education during which he reminisced of his earlier times at SHSU, often while seen sporting a PKA baseball cap.

Preceded in death by his loving parents and grandparents. Survived, loved and admired by his son Charles Robinson and numerous cousins.
