



Joseph "Joe" Sylvan Bates

July 16, 1923 - June 11, 2015

Joseph Sylvan Bates passed away on June 11, 2015. He was born in Carthage, Missouri on July 16, 1923. He served during WWII stationed in Italy flying P51 mustangs as a fighter pilot. After the war he returned to Missouri to go to college where he met his wife of 66 years, Margaret (Macy) McNeill Bates. After marrying they moved to Madison, Wisconsin so he could complete his degree in mechanical engineering at the University of Wisconsin. In 1951, they moved to Houston where he began his career in heating and air conditioning. Ten years later he opened his own business, Bates Engineering and Service Company, which thrived until he retired at age 63.

He and Margaret moved to Huntsville shortly after he retired to live his life enjoying golf at Elkins Lake. Joe was often described by his golfing friends as a "hot shot" golfer. In addition to golfing, he enjoyed taking trips with his friends at Elkins Lake and playing bridge. Joe loved to fish, especially in the clear streams of Missouri as a child and later where he canoed and fished with his family on vacation.

Joe was preceded in death by his sister Wilma Bates Webb, father Joseph Sylvan Bates Sr., and mother Bird Frost Bates.

He is survived by his wife, children Dan Bates and Nancy Kapellas, daughter-in-law April Bates, son-in-law Jeff Kapellas, and grandchildren Jordan and

Karl Bates.

“ I am very sorry to hear that Joe died. Have had several talks with him when playing golf with all of the "boys" at Elkins Lake. I still remember one time where I was out playing a foursome with all of the men - almost everyone around 75 or 80 years old. I ended up in the cart with Joe - Wayne Collins telling me that it would be good for me to spend time with this guy Joe - so I did.

After spending almost four hours together Joe thanked me for a good day (I believe we picked up a few dollars too). He turned his head towards Wayne Collins and said out loud that I was a good kid. I told him that I was close to 40 years old and Joe replied that "you may be close to 40 and a grown up at home but in Elkins you're still a kid." :)

After meeting him - and I am not exaggerating - I must have told his story on the WWII missions to many of my friends ending up with the conclusion that guys like Joe was one of the reasons that German is not my first language.

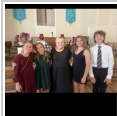
