



Judy Nimmo Sugg

October 9, 1939 - September 17, 2022

Judy Nimmo Sugg, 82, entered into the presence of Jesus on September 17, 2022.

Judy was a devoted wife of 54 years and a loving mother and grandmother. She is survived by her husband, Norman Sugg, son and daughter-in-law, Gene and Stacy Sugg, and grandchildren, Alec and Avery Sugg. She is also survived by her brother and sister-in-law, Robert and Shirley Nimmo. Judy was preceded in death by her loving parents, Bob and Lillian Nimmo.

Judy was born in Houston, Texas, on October 9, 1939, where she spent her early childhood years. Upon her father being drafted into the Navy during World War II, her family moved to San Diego when Judy was four years old. After three years in San Diego, they returned to Houston where she lived until middle school. Judy's early years were filled with dreams of becoming a movie star, and she loved the age of glamour in Hollywood. Her family then moved to Huntsville where she lived the remainder of her school age years.

Judy attended Huntsville High School and was active in journalism, drama, and band. She was editor of the high school newspaper and editor of the yearbook. After graduation, she attended Sam Houston State University where she received her undergraduate and master's degree in Education.

Judy started her teaching career in Spring Branch where she taught for 8 years. During this time, she met Norman Sugg while attending Second Baptist Church in Houston. They were married on June 21st, 1968, and Norman and Judy spent 54 wonderful years together.

Norman and Judy spent their early years living in Houston and Austin, but ultimately moved back to Huntsville where Judy spent the remainder of her life.

Judy taught 2nd and 3rd grade at Gibbs Elementary in Huntsville for 26 years and was named Teacher of the Year for the Huntsville Independent School District in 1994. She loved being a teacher and being a role model of grace and kindness to her students.

Judy was a faithful follower of Christ and devoted her life to serving Him. She was active in the First Baptist Church and enjoyed many years attending Sunday School, volunteering in the library, teaching Vacation Bible School, serving meals with the benevolence committee, and serving on several pastoral search committees.

Judy's greatest love besides the Lord was her family. She enjoyed music, singing, baking, and preparing beautiful meals for her family. Her pride and joy were her grandchildren and spending time with them.

Judy's service will be held at First Baptist Church, Huntsville, Texas, on Saturday, September 24, 2022. Visitation will take place from 10:00-11:00 followed by her service from 11:00-12:00.
