December 4, 1943 - December 19, 2009

Julie Anne Coman, 66 died Thursday, December 10, 2009 at Conroe Regional Medical Center in Conroe, Texas. Julie was born on December 4, 1943 in Amesbury, Massachusetts to Armand and Julie Anne Houle. She graduated from Amesbury High School in 1962. She attended college at the University of Massachusetts, where she met and married John F. Coman. They made their first home in West Springfield, Massachusetts, then Southington, Connecticut and eventually moving to Plano, Texas; Thousand Oaks, California; El Paso, Texas; and finally settling in Montgomery, Texas. Julie was an accomplished artist and photographer, a fierce competitor, a peerless wit, and was without question the original earth mother. She was a force of nature, not to be trifled with, never to be forgotten. Her husband said her epitaph will be, "She was never boring."
