Larry Wayne Norris went home to be with the Lord on January 17, 2015 in Huntsville, Texas at the age of 59.

Larry is survived by his wife Debbie Norris, mother Barbara Norris, step-daughter Cameo Bua, brother Keith Norris; sister-in-law Patty Norris, nieces Jasmin Norris, Natalie Norris, and Aneila Baker and her husband Jordan; sister-in-law Ann Whitener, and husband Ron Whitener, and by numerous beloved family members and friends. He was preceded in death by his father, Wayne Norris.

Larry was born on November 3rd, 1955 in Beeville, TX to Wayne and Barbara Norris. He graduated from Prairie Lea High School in 1975. He married Debbie Edwards-Bua in 1987. Larry recently retired from his career as a chemical dependency counselor at the Community Supervision and Corrections Department in Walker and surrounding counties. Larry had a genuine concern for his co-workers and clients.

Larry was a long-time devoted member of the Christian Motorcyclists Association and the Fellowship of Huntsville Church. Besides riding his Harley to try to reach the lost & hurting for Jesus, he enjoyed training his Chesapeake Bay Retrievers, fishing, and working on his property.

A funeral is scheduled for 11:30am on Saturday, January 24th at the Fellowship of Huntsville Church. Senior Pastor, C.F. Hazelwood, will officiate. Interment will be at Riverside Pioneer Cemetery. All are welcome to attend and celebrate Larry's life.
