Larry Moxey Pynes was born May 10, 1945 in Pittsburg, Texas to Tandy and Jeannette Pynes . Larry passed away peacefully at his residence in Waterwood, Texas on October 3, 2008, after a long, brave 12 year battle with cancer. He was born and raised in Pittsburg, Texas. After graduating high school, Larry attended several years of college before going to work at the Red River Army Depot in New Boston, TX, where he was employed for 15 years. In 1981 he relocated to Trinity, Texas and shortly after became employed as the Vice President of Operations at First National Bank in Trinity until 1994. Larry was employed by the Texas Department of Criminal Justice for the past 14 years as an Accountant III in the Inmate Trust Fund.
