Leonora “Nora” Jazon Bahou of Willis, Texas passed away into God’s arms on Monday, May 19, 2014 at the age of 76. She was born in Leyte province of the Philippines on May 16, 1938. She was the fourth child of nine from Lorenzo Jazon and Elena Esmas Jazon. She began her life of service to others when she became a registered nurse in 1962. As part of the first wave of Filipino trained nurses to come to the United States, Nora sought the American dream and migrated to Houston, TX in 1963. A dedicated caregiver for over 37 years, she made life long friendships doing what she loved, first as a floor nurse then aiding in groundbreaking eyesight surgery. She retired as an ophthalmic surgical nurse with Methodist Hospital. But work was only a small part of her life. A dedicated Catholic and single mother of two, she was a phenomenal cook. So good were her egg rolls that friends and co-workers alike asked her to make them as presents. A world-traveler, she loved music and to dance. Even when life threw her lemons, she made lemonade. She beat the odds as a nearly 20-year liver transplant survivor, she still loved to socialize with friends and family and to laugh. She is survived by her daughter, Jackie Johnston; son-in-law, Jimmy Johnston; son, Tony Bahou; grandchildren, Stephen Andrews, Lillian Bahou, Beau Bahou; and great-granddaughter, Aubree’ Andrews.
