Upon graduating Huntsville High School, she attended Sam Houston as a Music Major. In 1984 she graduated the Joe G. Davis School of Nursing with her LVN.

During her lifetime, she held multiple positions, including executive assistant at NASA, Daycare owner and a nurse, working for Dr. Monday and at TDCJ/UTMB.

For the past 4 years, she turned a hobby into a profession and began 12th Street Antiques with her daughters. Along with George Russell, she was instrumental in restoring the building to its original form. Kathryn said many times, her greatest joy with the store was meeting people talking with the customers.

In her spare time, Kathryn enjoyed painting, playing the piano, enjoying her large family and volunteering. She was very active with the DAR. Kathryn was elected Regent twice by The Mary Martin Elmore Scott chapter. While residing in Ft. Stockton, she established the Comanche Springs Chapter, where she also served as Regent.

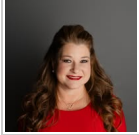
