She was 88 years old. Mrs. Linn was born August 21, 1917 in Pine Valley, on the Crawford family farm in Walker County, to Anna and John Deason. She began teaching piano as a teenager and continued to teach for most of her life. She is preceded in death by her husband, Mark Linn, a wonderful musician, who played and directed many bands, one of which was the Lawrence Welk Band. They married in 1941 and he passed away in 1968. Her spare time consisted of playing and teaching piano, gardening and traveling. She was a member of First Baptist Church, and dearly loved her Sunday school class members. Most important of all she loved her Lord and Savior. Mrs. Linn was preceded in death by a sister, Lela Mae Head of Huntsville; a sister Aurelia Early of La Porte; and one brother, Willie Deason of Willis.
