Lucille Humphreys Carroll of Huntsville, Texas went to be with her Lord and savior on February 22, 2009 at the age of 85 years. Her faith in God, strong internal will and determined constitution sustained her throughout a long battle with age related health issues. Lucille was born on November 13, 1923 in Oakhurst, Texas to the late William Baty Humphreys and the late Nettie Bessie King. She married Willie Lee (Bill) Carroll on August 7, 1940. They were married more than 56 years before Bill's death on December 28, 1996. Survivors include her daughter, Anita Duke and husband Edward of Huntsville, son Raymond W. Through the years she served the church as secretary, treasurer, Sunday school superintendent, homecoming chairperson and vacation Bible school director. She also volunteered her time for numerous projects and chaired the Pine Prairie Free Will Baptist Church Cemetery Committee for many years. She spent hours reading the Holy Bible and was quick to correct anyone that misquoted a verse. Her favorite verses include the 23rd Psalms, Romans 8:16-18 and John 14:1-3. Lucille was a staunch supporter of the former Pine Prairie School and long time member of the schools' "Mother's Club". She was a wonderful cook although she never measured anything. It was always a pinch of this and a handful of other ingredients. But it always seemed to turn out just right. Lucille was talented at many hand crafts. She loved to crochet, quilt and embroidery. She and her husband Bill always had a yard full of flowers. She was especially fond of iris, daffodils, gladiolas and roses. Having lived through the great depression era, she was frugal and determined not to throw anything away that might have a future use. She saved everything from jars to magazines and canned the vegetables grown in a large home garden. Her relatives and friends knew they could count on her in time of need. Anything from providing a hot meal to spending hours comforting loved ones in their homes or the hospital. Her other pleasures in life included gospel singing, visiting with family, her grandchildren and her great grandchildren. The family will receive friends on Friday, February 27th from 6:00 PM to 7:30 PM at the Sam Houston Memorial Funeral Home at 1700 Normal Park Drive in Huntsville, Texas. The funeral

service will be conducted at Pine Prairie Free Will Baptist Church on Saturday, February 28th, at 10:00 AM, with Dr. Ken Huggins, Rev. Paul Morris and Rev. Trent Dykes officiating.
