L. Anthony Wolfskill was born in Rankin, Texas on October 1, 1932, and went to be with his Lord on April 28, 2009 in Huntsville, Texas after a lengthy illness. Tony graduated from Lamar High School in Houston and went on to Texas A & M where he graduated in 1953 as a civil engineer. He served five years in the US Army and then came back to work on his education with two post graduate degrees from Texas A & M and one from Harvard University. He is survived by a large and loving family. Marylin, his wife of 55 years, lives in Huntsville. His children, Anthony, Andy, Betty, Arthur, Alan, and Christian, and his adoptive daughter, Gerda, all survive him. He has four daughters-in-law and two sons-in-law. Together there is a total of 16 grandchildren and eight great grandchildren in his extended family. Tony's sister, Barbara Bahrt, also survives him. Tony led an active life with respect to encouraging strong family values. He was deeply involved with the Methodist Church throughout his life, and actively participated in social activities with respect to Texas A&M. He was a great Aggie.
