After retiring in 1992, she moved to Huntsville to the home Charlie had built for them where they enjoyed their time gardening, raising cattle, visiting friends and relatives. Aliene was devoted and nurturing

to family, and when anyone had a need, she was there. She loved and looked forward to traveling with her sisters, nieces, and friends. She loved going to Coushatta Casino with her twin sister and she would always say with a chuckle, "I'm going to spend your inheritance" and her kids would always tell her to enjoy herself and that she earned it and could spend it how she wanted to. She looked forward to getting her hair done each week and would be dressed with her makeup on before breakfast. She enjoyed looking pretty. She was the first snooze alarm and Charlie would say "just five more minutes" every morning at least three times every morning. She always had his khaki's and his welding cap starched and ironed all his clothes, including his underwear, handkerchief, socks and boots were always laid out for him. She would always have his bath water drawn and breakfast on the table. Aliene was an avid Astros fan and especially when they were winning and enjoyed watching the Cowboys and Texans. She loved mowing the yard and in the early days used a push mower with no motor and in later years got herself a fancy riding mower. She loved and doted on her children and grandchild. She was a devoted wife, mother, grandmother, sister, aunt and friend. Services for Aliene were held Saturday, December 4, 2010, 10:00 a.m. at Sam Houston Memorial Funeral Home Chapel in Huntsville, Texas with Rev. James Ray Necker officiating.
