Marion Frank Thomas Marion Frank Thomas was born in Humble, Texas July 27, 1916 to James Allen and Edell (Brown) Thomas and passed away in Lufkin, Texas May 3, 2005. He served in the Army in WWII. After his time in the service he went into construction work. He bought his place in New Waverly in 1952. Due to the construction jobs he moved and drove to New Waverly on the week-ends and then would drive all night on Sunday to get back to work. He was a devoted family man, always seeing that they were taken care of. He loved to hunt and fish and the outdoors. He served as Deacon at both the New Waverly Baptist Church and University Heights Baptist Church over the years. He taught Sunday school and was available to serve his church in many ways. Frank was a fifty year member of Masonic Lodge and he served as Paster Master of John Sims Lodge #458 A.F. & A.M. five different times. He also served as a District Deputy for the Grand Lodge of Texas, 32 degree Scottish Rite Body of Houston, a Schriener and also a member of the Huntsville Chapter #240 Order of Eastern Star. In 1968 and 1969 he served as Worthy Patron while Murdelle was Worthy Matron before they were married to each other. He is survived by his wife Murdelle of Lufkin, son Claud Thomas of Huntsville and son Robert Frank Thomas of Pettersburg, MI and six grandchildren. He was preceded in death by his parents and daughter Barbara Ann. The family will receive friends Friday May 6, 2005 from 5:00-8:00 pm at the funeral home. Services will be held at 10:00 am Saturday May 7, 2005 in the Chapel of Sam Houston Memorial Funeral

Home. Interment will follow at Hill Cemetery near New Waverly under the direction of Sam Houston Memorial Funeral Home.
