and their family . They were members of the 82nd Airborne Division Association , Magnolia United Methodist Church , Eastern Star & Masonic Lodge . They retired in 1984 to travel and enjoy working their ranch full time for the rest of their productive days . Mary was never one to complain , always encouraged others , and literally wore out bibles . She was a tremendous blessing to all who knew her. She was a living testimony of a Christian life well lived . She will join her husband to rest in peace together at the Houston Veterans National Cemetery on Monday September 1st 2014 just in time for their 67th wedding anniversary on the 7th.
