MILDRED CARR DAVIS Mildred Louise Carr was the 5th of 6 children born to James Elbert and Pearl Mae Carr on April 9, 1923 in Mooringsport, Louisiana. Shortly after birth the family re-located to Bedias, TX where her father was a share cropper for the Upchurch family. Her grade school years were spent working, playing and learning there. The family moved to Willis during her high school years where she was a cheerleader for Willis High School. It was there that she caught the eye of her future husband. She married A.L. Davis, Sr. October 18, 1941. She assisted her husband A. L. Davis, Sr. with his business in the early days taking care of the books for the City Ice Company in Cleveland, Texas. In 1953 her husband started a welding company in Cleveland and she continued doing the books for this new business. In 1955 they relocated the family and the business to South Texas in Sinton. During this time she started an Amway business of her own while continuing to assist with the welding business. In the late 70's after her husband retired from the welding company, they worked for a management company selling mobile homes in Sinton. This venture led them to Austin, Texas where they constructed a mobile home park and managed various apartment complexes. When Alvin became ill they retired and moved back to Cleveland, Texas. After he passed way, she returned to work managing apartment complexes until the time she retired. In her married life she lived in many locations holding various jobs, but the most important was "mom". Meme always put others first whether, sewing for family and friends or working with flowers. She was
