M. O. (Billy) Grissom died Tuesday, October 18, 2005, at his home in Montgomery, Texas. At the time of his death, he owned and operated Longview Truck Sales in Montgomery, and was the oldest living truck dealer in the U.S. He was a decorated World War II veteran to whom we owe a debt of honor for fighting in 5 major battles, which included the Battle of the Bulge. A Visitation was held on Thursday, October 20, 2005, from 6-8 p.m., at Sam Houston Memorial Funeral Home. A Celebration of Life service was held at 2:00 p.m. on Friday, October 21, 2005 in the Sam Houston Memorial Funeral Home Chapel, Montgomery, Texas.

There was a visitation on Saturday, October 22 from 11a.m. - 1:00p.m., at Bluebonnet Hills Funeral Home, followed by a military interment at 2:00 p.m. in Bluebonnet Hills Funeral Home Cemetery in Colleyville, Texas, under the direction of Sam Houston Memorial Funeral Home.

He was preceded in death by his wife, Dee, and is survived by his loving family; one brother and sister-in-law; Bennie and Mary Grissom, daughters and sons-in-law: Inez Parsons, Billie and Jim Parson, Anita and John Clements, and Rita and Carl Rich; 10 grandchildren; 12 great-grandchildren; 1 great-great granddaughter; and many other relatives and friends including
